It's easy to move files like documents, email, photos, music, and movies When you start your MacBook Air for the first time, Setup Assistant will help you get going. Just follow a few simple steps to guickly connect to your Wi-Fi to your new Mac from another Mac or a PC. The first time you start your network, transfer your stuff from another Mac or a PC, and create a user new Mac, it will walk you through the process step by step. All you have to do is follow the onscreen instructions.

You'll also be able to log in with your Apple ID, so you can download apps from the App Store, shop the iTunes Store and the Apple Online Store, access iCloud, and make video calls with FaceTime. If you don't have an Apple ID. creating one is easy and free.

Switch between full-screen apps Swipe with three fingers to move from one full-screen app to another.




